CAMP REGISTRATION

Register early to avoid disappointment. Registrations will be processed in the order received. No spaces will be held without full payment. Once registration and fees are received, participants will receive an e-mail confirmation with a link to a camper packet that contains pick-up authorization forms, health forms, publicity consent forms and pre and post-care forms. **All forms must be returned before a child will be admitted to camp.** It is the responsibility of the participant to appear in camp on the correct day and hour without additional notice.

CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS

Oglebay Institute is committed to offering a wide variety of camps. As a result, camps sometimes have to be cancelled due to insufficient enrollment. In such cases, you will be notified no later than 72 hours before the camp start date and the full fee will be refunded. Oglebay Institute reserves the right to substitute instructors.

Typically, in order for participants to cancel and receive a full refund, they must cancel at least 2 WEEKS before the camp start date. In addition, a cancellation fee of \$20 is in effect for cancellations made after June 1, even those made within the two-week cancellation period.

Ages 4 - Entering Kindergarten
